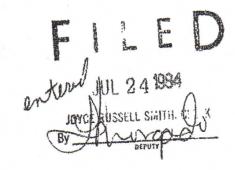

The motion of plaintiff County of Sacramento for permanent injunctive relief was regularly heard on August 24, 1983, with Richard G. Llata, Deputy County Counsel, appearing for plaintiffs, and Charles J. Miller, appearing for defendants Herbert W. Neils, Billy E. and Eleanor J. Morrison, Roger D. and Bertha J. Cottrell, Alfred N. and Mary L. Ganz, Irvine D. and Ada L. Palmer, Thomas J. and Mary L. Lester, Jack E. and Margaret F. Whitfield, Owen F. and Donna G. Brosh, Leonard L. and Constance A. Scott, Wesley G. and Maryanne Alcorn, Harvey C. and Patricia A. Simpkins, Robert and Marlene A. Lore, William F. and Carol A. Benard, David C. Henderson and Melanie S. Riegar, Ronald S. and Deane A. Law, Robert G. and Sue M. Mosser, Don L. and Patsy A. Welder, and Edgar Carp. The matter having come to trial and the

court having heard the testimony and evidence adduced, and the matter having been submitted.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED:

4.

- 1. As to Sunrise Farms, relating to lots 1 through 14, the County of Sacramento does not own any easement over said lots and therefore the County's request for permanent injunctive relief is denied as to Sunrise Farms lots 1 through 14.
- 2. As to Farmette Hills, relating to Lots 1 through 9, a permanent injunction is granted for a fifty (50) foot easement for equestrian and pedestrian use only.
- 3. As to Sunrise Farms Unit No. 2, relating to Lots A and 30 through 44, a permanent injunction is granted for a twenty-five (25) foot easement for hiking, equestrian trail and bikeway.
- 4. The County may install a six (6) foot fence on the Farmette Hills easement line. Said fence shall have a four (4) foot opening (entryway) in it for each of the Farmette Hills lots 1 through 9. The owners of said lots 1 through 9 may install gates in their own respective entryways at their own expense and in such a manner so as not to damage the County fence.
- 5. As to Farmette Hills, relating to Lots 1 through 9, and as to Sunrise Farms Unit No. 2, relating to Lots 30 through 44, the owners of the respective lots are hereby required to remove any fences that they have built into the easement.
- 6. Other manmade obstructions that interefere with the use of the County easement, e.g., Bar-B-Ques, decks, patios, pools,

etc., shall be removed by the respective homeowners from within the County easement. The removal of manmade obstructions does not include the removal of trees, shrubs, or other fauna.

- 7. Homeowner sprinkler or irrigation systems shall only be required to be removed from the County easement if the systems, or portions thereof, interfere with the use of the trails or pose a safety hazard to travelers on the trails within the easement.
- 8. Prior to the construction of improvements in the easement, the homeowners shall be given forty-five (45) days written notice to remove obstructions from the easement by the Sacramento County Department of Parks and Recreation.
 - 9. Each side shall bear their own attorney's fees.
 - 10. As to Farmette Hills defendants, no costs are awarded.
- 11. As to Sunrise Farms defendants, costs are awarded to them in the amount of \$1,000.00 as stipulated by the parties.
