Be prepared when calling 9-1-1!

The 9-1-1 Dispatcher will ask for your location.

Please try and describe anyone involved in the emergency.

If a car is involved in the emergency, try to remember the color and type of car.

Don't hang up until told to do so!



NEVER practice dialing 9-1-1 on a real phone!



Calling 9-1-1 as a joke is <u>never</u> funny!

When you need help from a FIREMAN, or a POLICEMAN, or when someone is really hurt or really sick and needs an AMBULANCE!



9-1-1 is the number to call to get help in a police, fire or medical emergency. 9-1-1 is for emergencies when people are in danger. A 9-1-1 call is sent over special phone lines to the emergency agency (police or fire) for the city or area you are calling from. Trained dispatchers then send the emergency help you need.

When should I call 9-1-1?

1. 9-1-1 is for "people" emergencies, or when people are in danger.

- 2. It should never be used as a joke or prank.
- 3. You should call 9-1-1 when there is a serious "people" emergency and there is a REAL need for any of the following:
 - There is a crime and you need the POLICE.
 - There is a fire and you need FIREFIGHTERS.
 - Someone is seriously injured or unconscious and you need an AMBULANCE.



How do I dial 9-1-1?

1. Stay calm.

2. Make sure you know the exact location and address of the emergency.

- 3. Pick up the receiver and wait for the dial tone or turn on the cell phone.
- 4. Dial or press "9", then "1" and then "1" again.
- 5. Wait for the ring and the 9-1-1 Dispatcher will answer and ask about your emergency.
